**Call for Nominations**

At the ICMP 2013 in Brighton (<http://www.icmp2013.org/>) we intend to acknowledge the contribution made by medical physicists to healthcare by having a display of posters in the conference foyer. National and regional medical physics organizations are invited to nominate medical physicists, and other closely related professionals, who have made an outstanding contribution to the advancement of medical physics and healthcare through research, clinical developments, education and training activities, service development, and to professional matters over the last 50 years. Nominations will also be accepted from other organizations and individuals. Whilst in most cases the contribution will be of international importance, there may be individuals who have made such a significant contribution nationally or regionally that they should be recognized.

Proposals should be emailed to [peterhssmith@btinternet.com](mailto:peterhssmith@btinternet.com) by no later than 1<sup>st</sup> March 2013. The proposal should include 2 -3 paragraphs highlighting what the individual had achieved and the impact on medical physics and healthcare, together with contact details, including email address, of the person making the nomination. No more than 50 proposals will be selected.

The relevant national or regional medical physics organization will be asked to supply full details, including a photograph and proposed text suitable for a poster, of those nominees selected to enable a poster to be prepared. The final editorial responsibility will be with the conference organizing group and IPEM will prepare and print the posters using a standard design.
