

## Report on the WC2015 Activities to IUPESM Members

### Summary

The Congress will be comprised of six (6) days of courses, plenaries and scientific sessions for a total of over 400 sessions, with the space and preliminary program accommodating up to 20 concurrent sessions. The congress chairs - Dr. David Jaffray and Dr. Tony Easty - have been working closely with the host organizations - the Canadian Organization of Medical Physicists (COMP) and the Canadian Medical and Biological Engineering Society (CMBES) – to set the stage for WC2015. Weekly teleconference calls are held (nominal 2 week intervals) to address the various issues and prepare for the upcoming 18 months before WC2015. This activity is now well underway with a strong working relationship between the two host organizations in-place. The professional congress organization has been selected and final negotiations will be completed shortly. Membership of the COC committee leadership has been defined and we are preparing to meet with the PCO for the kick-off meeting. Overall, we are on-track, but timelines are tight and there is much work to be done. We are looking forward to welcoming the world to Toronto from June 7<sup>th</sup> to June 12<sup>th</sup>, 2015.

### Detailed Activities

#### 1. Selection of the Professional Congress Organizer (PCO)

After initiating a request for bids early in 2013, the host organizations have worked to select the PCO. We have secured the services of International Conference Services (ICS) who will be providing professional congress organization services. ICS has many years of experience organizing very successful events all over the world and we are pleased to be partnering with them to deliver a successful congress. There have been significant negotiations between the host organizations and ICS to maximize cooperation in the pursuit of industry sponsorship, maximize attendance, and assure financial success. The contract should be signed by Sept 7<sup>th</sup>, 2013 at the latest. This will be followed by a 'kick-off' meeting between the COC committee chairs and the PCO congress manager. The PCO leads the preparation and execution of the communication strategy (website, sponsorship requests, materials, etc) which will begin in earnest in October 2013.

#### 2. Finalization of COC Committee Chairperson Membership

The COC Executive has been working hard to build a strong team that assures representation from both hospital and academic engineers and physicists. The composition of the COC is shown below. The committee chairs have been appointed and represent a cross-section of experience to support the Congress as the world's leading forum for presenting current scientific work in health-related physics and technologies to an international audience. As a major event for science, medicine and technology, the Congress provides a comprehensive

overview and in-depth, first-hand information on new developments, advanced technologies and current and future applications.
