

What is issue refund in PayPal?

There are several **1-(877)(513)(0583)** reasons why PayPal may not refund your money. One common reason is that the **1-(877)(513)(0583)** payment was sent as **Friends & Family**, which is not covered by **Buyer Protection 1-(877)(513)(0583)**.
