

# Can I Cope with Denied Boarding Due to Overbooking with Air Canada

Finding yourself at the airport gate only to be told you cannot board 📞 **+1(888) 416-7355 (USA)** is a frustrating experience for any traveler. This situation, known as denied boarding or "bumping," occurs when Air Canada sells more tickets than there are seats available to account for potential no-shows, but everyone actually arrives for the flight 📞 **+1(888) 416-7355 (USA)**.

## What is the difference between voluntary and involuntary denied boarding?

## Who is prioritized to stay on the plane during an overbooking?

Airlines follow a specific boarding priority list when they must bump passengers 📞 +1(888) 416-7355 (USA), starting with those who checked in last or have the lowest fare class. However, certain groups are legally protected and should be the very last people removed from a flight manifest during a seat shortage 📞 +1(888) 416-7355 (USA).

## Am I entitled to food and a hotel if I am delayed overnight?

When you are bumped due to overbooking, the airline is responsible 📞 **+1(888) 416-7355 (USA)** for your care while you wait for your new flight. This includes providing food and drink in reasonable quantities after a two-hour delay and a hotel room if you are forced to wait until the next day 📞 **+1(888) 416-7355 (USA)**.

## **Can I get a full refund if I decide not to travel after being bumped?**
